

Interface Update - Testing

We're always looking for effective ways to enhance and streamline users' symplr Learning experience. The testing interface enhances visibility of important status details and overall progression, allowing users to complete their assigned courses faster and easier than before and leaving them more time to focus on the rest of their work.


What's changed?


The **Tests** page in symplr Learning has been given a complete visual overhaul, making it easier to navigate the test, while knowing your exact progression and overall completion status. The old dropdown menu navigation has been replaced with a sidebar containing direct links to individual questions, and we've also made it easier to understand which buttons proceed to the next question or back to the previous page.

How do I use it?

Like the previous design, launching the test displays the question and its answer options at the top of the page. The **Back**, **Clear Answer**, and **Next Question** buttons sit directly underneath the answer choices.

New to this design is the blue sidebar column along the left side of the page. A circular indicator states your completion percentage, in addition to how many questions out of the total amount you have answered. The test name displays below this gauge.






The **number buttons** correspond to specific test questions. Selecting a number from this array displays that question number in the space to the right. After answering a question, its number

button fills in with a dark blue color. Skipping past a question without selecting an answer leaves the button un-filled, making it easier to notice before submitting for grading.

Finally, at the bottom of this column are two more buttons. Selecting **Exit** abandons your test-in-progress (*Note:* Some tests may save your partial progress, but many do not allow this). Selecting **Submit** sends your test to be graded by the system.

Upon clicking **Submit** a confirmation page displays, and the button text changes to **Grade Test**. At this point, the system checks your submission and notifies you of any unanswered questions. Selecting **Grade Test** displays your test summary, which includes your score and pass/fail status.

From this page, you may select **Review Missed Questions** to view the



answers to any incorrect responses. At any time during this review, selecting **Summary** restores the summary view.

After reviewing your results, selecting **Exit** returns you to your **To-Do List**.
